## **2022 Recordkeeping Monitoring Exercise**



- Re-commencement of annual monitoring exercise
- Key objective for 2022 establish a baseline and overview of the level of maturity and conformity of public offices' records management
- Assessments made using the new RMAT
- 246 public offices or 65% of the jurisdiction responded:
  - 117 Departments, Agencies, Authorities
  - 13 Local Health Districts or health networks
  - 102 Councils
  - 9 Universities
  - 5 State Owned Corporations

#### The results



- Average scores have been produced for each question and category in the RMAT
- Overall average total score for the jurisdiction is 2.67 out of 5, baseline compliance is 3.
- Overall maturity level for jurisdiction is "Developing".

#### Average total score for each RMAT question






#### Average total score for each category



**People and Governance** (Q1 - 9) explores if frameworks in place to manage records and information management.

**Systems and Business** (Q10 – 14) explores the security and protection of records, information accessibility/discoverability/use and re-use, ensuring records are reliable and trustworthy, & that records and information management requirements in design and management of IT systems or services.

**Information Management** (Q15 – 19) explores creation, collection and capture of records, records storage, the retention and disposal of records, records transfer to the State Archives Collection, and the making of Access Directions.

- Submissions will be made using the new Monitoring Portal
- Communications will be sent to all public offices closer to the start of the Monitoring Exercise
- What can you do to prepare?
  - Review this year's submission and assessment
  - Identify where work has been done to improve gaps in maturity
  - Identify the evidence that supports the level of maturity you have chosen
- In 2023 we will
  - Compare the 2022 and 2023 data to determine if there has been any change
  - Look more closely at the evidence identified in each submission and if this supports the level of maturity chosen
