EmDARA Project

When State Records' bid for a ten year project called DAPRA (Digitisation of Archives for Preservation and Regional Access) was unsuccessful, State Records focussed on those State archives with the most urgent need for digitisation and preservation, the State archives that are at risk of loss because of chemical degradation and/or technical obsolescence.

State Records' Minister The Hon Dominic Perrottet MP, Minister for Finance and Services approved a request to commence digitisation of these archives. A new project has commenced at State Records aimed at digitising many of these at risk archives. The project is called EmDARA - Emergency Digitisation of At Risk Archives.

State archives that fall into this category include videos, cassettes, tapes (data and audio), negatives, films, slides, floppy discs, CD-ROMS and transparencies. The resulting master digital copies will be stored as part of the Digital State Archive. Not only does this project offer State Records an opportunity to save the content of these State archives, it will also be the first time it has been possible to provide access to the public for those items open to public access. The films in particular will provide a rich source of social history. It will also make it simpler to provide access to the responsible agency if that is required.

Below are examples of State archives that have experienced chemical degradation. As serious as this is, State Records and other archives and libraries are equally concerned with technical obsolescence. The technology to play or use many of the formats that once seemed cutting edge is now rare and becoming rarer.

- a disposal authority for Transport for NSW documenting the provision of passenger transport services, in particular records relating to passenger ticketing.
